## 2025 SCAC BARRETT LAWRIMORE MEMORIAL REGIONAL COOPERATION AWARD



Greenville County alongside Pickens County, has been awarded the 2025
Barrett Lawrimore Regional Cooperation Award by the South Carolina
Association of Counties (SCAC). The award recognizes outstanding
intergovernmental collaboration demonstrated during the joint response to the
Table Rock Complex Fire this past March. Spanning nearly 16,000 acres, the
wildfire became the nation's top-priority incident at the time. Thanks to the
coordinated efforts of more than 1,000 personnel from local, state, and federal
agencies, no structures were lost and no lives were harmed. This recognition
highlights the strength of regional partnerships and the commitment of
Greenville County departments, municipalities, county fire departments, and
our nonprofit and community partners. The teamwork and mutual support
between Greenville and Pickens Counties exemplify what true cooperation can
achieve. Greenville County extends sincere gratitude to the SCAC for this
honor-and to every responder, partner, and community member who stood
together when it mattered most.
